



**TIPS FOR SAFE SCHOOL BUS RIDING**

For a safe and enjoyable ride to and from school, follow these rules:

1. Leave home early enough to arrive at your bus stop on time.
2. Wait for your bus in a safe place—well off the roadway.
3. Enter your bus in an orderly manner, and take your seat.
4. Follow the instructions of your school bus driver or bus patrol.
5. Remain in your seat while your bus is in motion.
6. Keep your head and arms inside the bus at all times.
7. Keep aisles clear at all times.
8. Remain quiet and orderly.
9. Be courteous to your school bus driver and fellow passengers.
10. Be alert to traffic when leaving the bus.

Q—How long do I have to convert my Serviceman's Group Life Insurance to Veterans Group Life Insurance?

A—SGLI coverage continues for 120 days after separation from active duty. A veteran may apply for conversion to VGLI without evidence of insurability within the 120-day period. A veteran may apply for conversion to VGLI up to one year from date of separation by supplying evidence of insurability.

**Labor Day Traffic**

If the 1977 trend continues, Michigan motorists are headed for a new Labor Day driving record. Department traffic technicians estimate motorists will drive 680 million miles over the four-day holiday weekend. The estimate is 20 million miles over the 660-million mile record set on the 1976 four-day Labor Day weekend.

To prepare the 9,400-mile state highway system for anticipated record traffic volumes, State Highway and Transportation Director John P. Woodford has ordered suspension of all construction between 3 p.m. Friday, Sept. 2, and normal

starting times the following Tuesday, Sept. 6. Only emergency or other authorized work will be performed over the weekend. In addition, Woodford ordered a check of all detours and detour signing as well as construction areas.

Roadside rest areas throughout the state will be maintained over the weekend to assure service to holiday motorists. Traffic signal electricians also will be on call to handle emergencies and maintenance crews will be on call for pavement repair or other emergency work.
