- 1 pound beef, cubed pound veal, cubed

3. Serve with boiled rice

4. Wash rice thoroughly to remove loose starch; drain. Slowly drop the rice into a large amount of boiling salted water. 6. Boil uncovered about 20 minutes

or until kernels are soft. 7. To prevent rice from sticking to bottom of pan, stir it gently from time to time with a fork.

8. One cup uncooked rice will make about three cups after it is cooked.
