#### CHOP SUEY (Eight Servings)

- 1 pound beef, cubed
- 1 pound veal, cubed
- 1/2 pound pork, cubed
- 1 tablespoon shortening
- 1 cup chopped onion
- 1 tablespoon soy sauce
- 1 four-ounce can mushrooms
- 1 18-oz. can bean sprouts
- 1 tablespoon salt
- 2 cups boiling water



MISS HALL

- 1 cup raw rice
- 2 quarts boiling water
- 1. Brown meat in fat in a heavy kettle.
- 2. Add remaining ingredients except rice and cook slowly over a low heat about 1 1/2 hours or until meat is tender.
- 3. Serve with boiled rice.
- 4. Wash rice thoroughly to remove loose starch; drain.
- 5. Slowly drop the rice into a large amount of boiling salted water.
- 6. Boil uncovered about 20 minutes, or until kernels are soft.
- 7. To prevent rice from sticking to bottom of pan, stir it gently from time to time with a fork.
- 8. One cup uncooked rice will make about three cups after it is cooked.
