His outstanding play of the season was at Lowell when Taylor ran a kick-off play 96 yards for a TD. 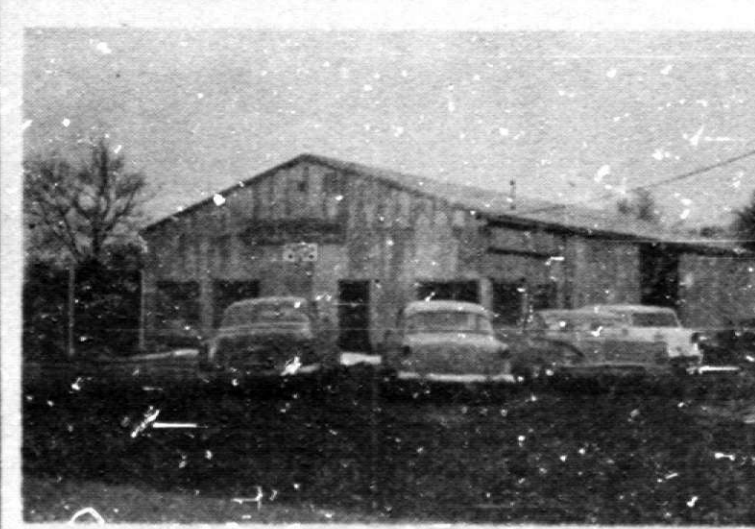
Rev. Arthur J. Bjork, 64, of Hawn Lake, died suddenly January 27 in West Palm Beach, Florida.

**AUTO OWNERS MUST  
FILL OUT THEIR  
OWN APPLICATIONS**

Last year the Michigan Depart-  
ment of State mailed out three  
million license plate applications  
to all persons on record as having  
automobiles registered in Michi-  
gan. These applications contained  
the name, address, car type and  
other information required to ob-  
tain new license plates.

This year, due to sharp budget  
cuts by the Legislature in an at-  
tempt to bring governmental costs  
down toward anticipated State in-  
come, this long-established ser-  
vice will not be offered.

Each person applying for 1959  
plates must fill out his own li-  
cense application.  
Michigan Department of State  
officials stress that these applica-  
tions must be printed in black ink  
or typewritten on black ribbons.  
By following this request car own-  
ers can help the State save money  
and do a more efficient job. More-  
over, each license will be neater  
and easier to read and the efficient  
automated processing machines  
used by the Department of State  
will operate with fewer errors and  
at a higher work capacity per  
machine.

Application blanks are available  
in all branch offices of the Secre-  
tary of State.
