

Muskegon Piston Ring Sales Show 12 Percent Quarter Rise

An increase in sales of 12 percent for the third quarter of 1963 compared to the same period last year and an increase of 10 percent in sales for the first nine months of this year compared to 1962 was announced in the quarterly report to stockholders by G. W. Lundeen, president of the Muskegon Piston Ring Company.

Net earnings, after provision for Federal Income Taxes, according to Mr. Lundeen, presented an even more impressive comparison. For the third quarter net earnings were 33 percent higher this year than in 1962, while figures for the nine-month period show a 17 percent increase this year over last.

For the quarter ending September 30, 1963, net sales were \$4,399,000 compared to the same period in 1962 of \$3,944,000 and in 1961 of \$3,411,000. The first nine months of this

year showed net sales of \$13,770,000 with net earnings of \$876,000 and net earnings per share (based on 524,435 shares) of \$1.67.

Figures for the same nine-month period in 1962 were as follows: Net sales, \$12,551,000 - net earnings, \$752,000 - net earnings, \$1.43.

Norman Eradford Holstein Hits Lactation Record

A five-year-old registered Holstein cow owned by Norman Bradford of Sparta Ave. has completed a lactation record of 23,078 pounds of milk and 732 pounds of butterfat in 305 days. Less than 50 of the 75,000 cows on test in Michigan dairy herd improvement associations exceed 22,000 pounds in 305 days according to records kept in the DHIA Data Processing Center

at Michigan State University.

The average DHIA cow produces about 11,300 pounds of milk in a 305-day lactation, reports Robert Kniseley, county extension agent in Kent County. The average Michigan cow produces about 8,000 pounds.
