Chester Parker of Edgerton will entertain with old-time tunes on his dulcimer at the Hootenanny to be held at 8:00 P.M. on Saturday, April 25, in the Sparta High School gymnasium. The event is being sponsored by the Sparta Band Boosters to raise funds for new band uniforms.

Also on the program will be the Cumberland Trio; the Townsmen Three; Tommy Jay and the Ambassadors, a folk-singing duo, Marie and Cecilia; and Ralph Wells with the bass fiddle. Stewart Mossman is the master of ceremonies.

Tickets are on sale for \$1.00 each and can be purchased from any band member or Sparta Band Booster.

At 72 years old, Chet Parker Sr. of Algoma Township could be starting a rather lucrative career in the entertainment field.

Parker, a witty man with a great deal of homespun Parker sense, has been entertaining on his homemade dulcimer for 50 years, but it was a single engagement with the New World Singers at Silver Jack Wanigan (an eating place with a lumberjack atmosphere) that brought him attention from a fairly wide area.

The dulcimer and Parker's fine old tunes fitted nicely with the big swing to folk tunes and Gil Turner, leader of the New World Singers, invited Parker to travel with them to Chicago for engagements and possible record-making and then on to New York.

"I had to tell 'em 'naw," says Parker. "Heck, I'm too old for that sort of thing."

Suggest Hamburgers

Plentiful supplies of all cuts of beef, including steaks and roasts, make this an excellent time for the food shopper to indulge her family in many beef dishes they enjoy.

This recipe for Ranchburgers features a western flavor that's sure to tempt the small fry.

To prepare 4 patties, combine 1 pound ground beef with 1/2 teaspoon salt, 1 tablespoon grated onion, and 1/4 cup catsup. Mix to blend and shape into 4 patties.

Baste the meat with sauce. Here's another dish with a western flavor — Barbecued Hamburgers. To prepare, heat 1 tablespoon oil in fry pan, add 1 tablespoon finely chopped onion, and cook. Add 1 cup catsup, 1/4 cup dark corn sirup, 2 tablespoons worcestershire sauce, 1 1/2 teaspoons mustard-horseradish, 1 teaspoon vinegar, and 1/4 teaspoon each crushed rosemary, thyme, and oregano.

Simmer uncovered 15 minutes. Shape 1 pound ground beef into 4 patties and place in refrigerator dish. Pour sauce over patties, turning patties to insure uniform moistening. Cover dish tightly and refrigerate about 3 hours. Remove patties from marinade and broil.

Parker received his first dulcimer back in 1900 from Orin Beach, a Civil War veteran who lived nearby. Then in 1944 he made his own and that's the one he plays today. It cost about \$8.

He had taken two lessons on a violin and after that taught himself from an instruction book he ordered from the Montgomery Ward mail order house in 1905. The dulcimer he taught himself, rapping out his old tunes, with a few popular numbers in the folk tune field, with a couple of small hammers on the metallic wires stretched on the soundboard.

Parker plays for Grange dances and has made the coffee house tour, but he'd rather play for the country dances. His repertory includes music for square and round dances, waltz, fox trot and schottische — but nothing for the twist. He likes to watch the twisters, "but it's a mite too fast for me."

Parker's music has always been a part-time thing as he made his living blacksmithing, working as a railroad section hand and with a threshing crew or anything else that happened along when he needed a job.

Now he's content to stay home and play his dulcimer, accepting only occasional engagements.
