(3) Spacing of signs and billboards. No billboards shall be located within 1320 feet of another bill board or sign as defined in this ordinance including directional and other official signs on the same side of the highway. Such billboards or signs shall be at least 50 feet from the highway right-of-way.

F. No sign or billboard shall be within 300 feet of the boundary line of property on which a residence is located unless written approval of the owner of such property is

G. Signs or billboards shall not be stacked or placed one above the other and not more than one sign shall be permitted on a single location other than a double faced sign.

H. Requirements pertaining to all signs:

(1) Sign Building Permits: No person shall erect or re-locate or cause to be erected or relocated any sign or other advertising structure as defined in this ordinance without first obtaining a sign erection permit nor shall any person repair or alter or cause to be repaired or altered, any sign or advertising structure as defined in this ordinance to more than two-thirds (2/3) of the reement value of said sign or advertising structure without obtaining a sign erection permit.

(2) Procedure to Obtain Permit:

(a) Application for sign building permit. Application for sign erection permit shall be made upon forms provided by the Building Inspector and shall contain the following:

(1) Name, address, and telephone number of the

(ii) Location of building, structure, or lot to which or upon which the sign or other advertising structure is to be attached or erected.

(iii) Position of the sign or other advertising structure in relation to nearby buildings, structures. signs, or other advertising structures.

(iv) Two blueprints or ink drawings of the plans and specifications and method of construction and attachment to the building, or in the ground.

(v) Copy of street sheets and calculations showing the structure is designed for dead load and wind pressure in any direction of not less than 30 pounds per square foot of area.

(vi) Name of person, firm, corporation, or association erecting structure.

(vii) Written consent of the owner of the building, structure or land to which or on which the structure is

(viii) Any electrical permit required and issued for said sign. (ix) Certificate of insurance as required by Section 2.29H(8).

(3) Illuminated Signs: Approval by Electrical Inspector.

The application for a permit for erection of a sign or any other advertising structure in which electrical wiring or connections are to be used shall be submitted to the Electrical Inspector. The Electrical Inspector shall examine the plane and specifications respecting all wiring and connections to determine whether the same complies with the Township Building Code, and he shall approve said permit if the plans and specifications comply with said Code. The action of the Electrical Inspector shall be taken prior to submission of the application to the Building Inspector for final approval or disapproval of the sign erection permit.

(4) Issuance of Permit. It shall be the duty of the Building Inspector, upon the filing of an application for a sign erection permit to examine the plans and specifications and other data and the premises upon which it is proposed to erect the sign or other advertiming structure, and if it shall appear that the proposed structure is in compliance with the requirements of this ordinance, the remaining provisions of the Township Building Code and state law. As shall then issue the erection permit. If the work authorized under a sign erection permit has not been complete; within six (6) months of the date of issuance, the permit shall become mull and void.

ist Permit Forg. Every applicant, before lovery granted a permit bereunder, shall pay to the Treasurer the foilowing permit fee:

(a) All signs requireing a permit other than temporar, Dollars (\$1,000) of construction cost: One Dollar (\$1.00) for each auditional One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000).

(b) Temporary signs. 5 .00.

Five Dollars (\$5.00) .

(d) Fees may be changed by the Township Board at any regular meeting which change shall be effective 30 days from the date of publication of such change.

[6] Information to be Included on Sign. Every sign or other advertising structure hereafter creeted shall have painted in a conspicuous place thereon in letters not less than one inch in height. The date of erection, the permit number and the voltage of any electrical apparatus used in connection therewith.

(7) Painting Required every Two Years. The owner of any sign as defined and regulated by this ordinance shall be required to have properly pointed at least once every two galvanized or otherwise treated to prevent rugt or deterioration.

(8) Insurance Requirements. Every applicant for a sign erection permit shall file with the application for permit a certificate of insurance, certifying that the applicant is insured against codily injury and for property damage arising out of the erection, maintenance, repair, and replacement of the sign, in the following

Bedily injury:

\$100,000 each person 300,000 each accident

Property damage:

Each applicant if the permit is granted, shall be required to maintain said insurance and keep a certificate of insurance currently effective on file with the Township so long as the sign or signs are in existence. Said certificate shall provide that the Township shall receive ten (10) days written notice in case of cancellation of the policy. Any sign which is maintained in violation of the insurence requirements of this section shall be re-moved immediately and the cost of such removal shall be charged against the owner of the sign.
