

Sparta Harriers Qualify For State Meet

For the fourth time in the past six years, the Sparta High School cross country team will participate in the state meet to be held on Saturday at Ypsilanti. Although one or more individual runners have completed in the state meet each year, it is quite a distinction for a school to place that often.

The Spartans qualified for the state meet by placing third in the Regional Cross Country Meet held last Saturday at Mt. Pleasant. Rockford, winner of the Tri-River championship this year, tied with West Branch for 5th position. Sparta was the only conference team to qualify.

Six different regional meets held last week netted 18 teams to compete at Ypsilanti on Saturday for the state title.

The following harriers placed as follows for Sparta: Terry Jacht placed 1st, by the disqualification of Dale Russell of Cedar Springs. Dave Couturier ran 17th, Tom Badgerow 27th, Gordon Preston, 28th, Dan Member, 44th, Steve Heinbeck 45th, Jerry Tompkins 62nd. 24 teams of 163 boys were in competition.

Sparta finished the 1966 season in second place behind Rockford by placing second in the dual meets and in the conference meet. During the past six years that Don Worm has coached the Spartans, the local squad has won two championships outright, shared the crown three years, and placed second in the season just completed.

Sparta High School varsity football squad makes a last chance effort at a share of the Tri-River championship on Friday night as they travel to Cedar Springs to meet the Red Hawks at 7:30. Going into Friday's final conference game of the 1966 season, the Spartans are tied with the Belding Redskins with two wins, two losses and one tie each. Lowell presently leads the Tri-River League by a half game margin with three wins and one loss.

Comstock Park is in third place with a 2 - 2 record. Cedar Springs and Rockford share the cellar with two wins and three losses.
